SPECIALTY SERVICES

Beaumont Children's – These specially trained in-house physicians see 200,000 children and teens each year providing services in emergency care, hematology/oncology, newborn and pediatric intensive care, and pediatric and craniofacial surgery.

Beaumont Heart and Vascular Center – Featuring the Ernst Cardiovascular Center and Max and Debra Ernst Heart Center for treating complex heart and vascular conditions; the Ministrelli Women's Heart Center; and the Tyner Center for Cardiovascular Interventions, a hybrid OR/catheterization suite offering complex services in interventional cardiology, structural heart and minimally invasive cardiovascular surgery.

Beaumont Orthopedics – Offering a full range of specialized care, including minimally invasive surgery, implants and trauma surgery. One of the nation's highest-volume joint replacement surgical centers.

Beaumont Cancer Institute – Accredited by the Commission on Cancer and designated as a Blue Cross Center of Distinction for the Treatment of Complex and Rare Cancers. Services include the Proton Therapy Center for adult and pediatric cancers, Gamma Knife and brachytherapy.

Beaumont Surgical Services – Offering minimally invasive treatments including advanced endoscopic, laparoscopic and robotic approaches for the treatment of complex surgical conditions; the Simulation Learning Institute and Surgical Learning Center supports education for 15,000+ learners.

Beaumont Urology – Offering robotic, endoscopic and traditional surgery. Women's Urology and Pelvic Health Center is internationally recognized for the management of chronic pelvic pain and voiding dysfunction.

Beaumont Neuroscience – Treating all neurological conditions of the brain and spine for children and adults including stroke, epilepsy, Parkinson and Alzheimer disease, among others.

Digestive Health – Specialized care including bariatric surgery and medically-supervised weight loss programs.

Beaumont Eye Institute – Comprehensive primary and specialty medical and surgical eye care as well as diagnostic services are provided by Board Certified Ophthalmologists. Refractive surgical services including LASIK and PRK are provided.

Transplantation – Offering innovative and collaborative approaches for the treatment of end-stage renal and liver disease. The transplant team works with organ and tissue recovery programs to provide patients access to donors from across the nation.

Women's Health – Includes the Danialle & Peter Karmanos Jr. Karmanos Center for Natural Birth offering services to make traditional or natural birth safe and comfortable, and the Family Birth Center, mother baby care, women's urology and pelvic health center and reproductive genetics.
